

National Arena Swimming League Western Promoter's Conditions 2019

General Conditions

A1. Eligibility of swimmers:

a. Each swimmer participating in the National Swimming League shall have joined the team he or she represents before **1st October** in the year of competition and have registered his or her membership with that team with the relevant National Governing Body prior to that date.

[Note: This is determined by the National Committee as conformity is required across the country for entry into the national finals. It is subject to change by the National Committee.

b. The names, dates of birth and British Swimming registration numbers and British Swimming registration categories of swimmers who may be selected to swim for the team are to be forwarded to the League Secretary before *1st October* in the year of competition.

A swimmer will not be eligible to compete in any round if that swimmer is not registered with the league secretary before the **1st October** in the year of competition.

- c. A swimmer may not compete for more than one team in the National Arena Swimming League (All Divisions) during the 12-month period 1st May to 30th April.
- d. Any dispute as to eligibility shall be adjudged by the relevant SWIM ENGLAND Laws, Regulations & Technical rules.
- e. Any contingency not covered by these eligibility rules shall be referred to the Officers of the League for resolution.

Premier Division Only:

f. A swimmer selected for their team to compete in the National Final is only eligible if he or she has swum for their team in at least one of the NASLW rounds in the year of competition.

A2. Age Groups:

a. Age groups will be as at 31st December in the year of competition. Minimum ages for competitions in SWIM ENGLAND Regulations must be complied with.

A3. Event Restrictions:

a. All Divisions:

- i. Competitors may swim in a maximum of three individual events, two in their own age group (this includes three individual events in the open age group).
- ii. There is no restriction on the number of relays a swimmer may swim in.

[Note: This is determined by the National Committee as conformity is required across the country for entry into the national finals. It is subject to change by the National Committee.]



A4. Licensing of meets

Premier Division Finalist Gala:

The Premier Division Finalist Gala may be a licensed meet. The League Secretary will obtain the necessary licence.

Other Divisions Finalist Galas:

The Other Division Finalist Galas may be licensed meets. The League Secretary will obtain the necessary licences.

A5. Host teams, officials and other personnel required for galas:

Appointment of host teams:

a. The host team for each gala will be appointed by the League Secretary. The host team jobs are listed in the appendix as a check list.

Technical Officials:

b. Each team shall arrange to have a minimum of three officials, one qualified at Judge 2 or above, and at least one qualified at Judge 1 or above. A British Swimming qualified Time Keeper could be the third official. Officials should wear a white shirt, and white skirt or white long trousers. Shorts will NOT be appropriate but ¾ length trousers will be acceptable.

Technical Officials and other staff: Host teams:

- c. The League Secretary will appoint the gala Referee and Starter. The host team can if they wish to arrange a second Referee and Starter
- d. The host team will provide a Chief Timekeeper/s in addition to the officials specified in **A5b** above.
- e. The host team will provide the additional, non-technical personnel required to run the gala, such as door staff, recorders and drinks staff.

Technical Officials: Exception:

f. The League Secretary will appoint the Referee's and Starters for the Finalist Galas in each Division and notify the host team.

Qualifications of Technical Officials for Rounds 1 & 2:

- g. The judges must be British Swimming qualified judges.
- h. The Referee and Starter should be a minimum of J2(S) though a fully qualified referee and a fully qualified starter should be aimed at.

Special arrangements for the Finals (Round 3):

i. As the finals in all divisions may be licensed meets, the host team will be required to ensure that it is correctly staffed in line with licensing requirements drawing upon assistance from the other teams. All officials at licensed meets need to be licensed officials

<u>Technical officials - all galas</u>

j. Any personnel who may be required to enter areas which competitors under the age of 18 years use must comply with the National Governing Bodies Child Protection and Vulnerable Adults policy. If personnel are not DBS/CRB holders, self-declaration forms signed by individuals must be returned to the League Secretary with all gala returns. (A self declaration form can be found at the end of this document.)



A6. Penalties:

- a. Except in cases of force majeure, a team or team that fails to attend a gala will pay up to a maximum fine of £500 to the League and a deduction of 3 league points will be made. If the failure is in Round 1 the team or team will enter Round 2 with 3 league points deducted, even if this leads to a minus number.
- b. Except in cases of force majeure, a team that refuses to host a gala will pay up to a maximum fine of £500 to the League and a deduction of 3 League Points will be made. If the failure is in Round 1 the team or team will enter Round 2 with minus 3 points.
- c. Cases of force majeure must be notified to the League Secretary as soon as possible following the cause of the force majeure. (The league will still impose a fine if force majeure cannot be substantiated)
- d. In the event of breach of the team sheet declaration (for example a swimmer is not eligible or has incorrectly swum for more than one team), or the referee is not notified of team change, the points gained for the finishing position in the race will be deducted. Additionally, 10 points will be deducted from the gala points attained at the gala. (The deduction will be made after any adjustments made for galas with varying numbers of teams.) Officials names to be included with electronic team sheet, together with their qualification and membership number.
- e. In the event of failure to provide a required qualified technical official at a gala 20 points will be deducted for each technical official not provided or inappropriately dressed as in accordance with A5(b) from the gala points in that gala. (The deduction will be made after any adjustments made for galas with varying numbers of teams.)
- f. Any infringement of the conditions which cannot be resolved by the Referee shall be notified to the League Secretary within 24 hours of the gala for an investigation and decision by the League Secretary.
- g. Penalty points will be deducted by the League Secretary on receipt of the results from the host team.
- h. When the results of the gala are announced at the end of the gala it will be announced that these results are subject to any possible penalty resulting from the Promoter's Conditions not being complied with.
- i. An appeal may be made to the League Executive Officers (as defined in the constitution) against any penalty imposed, but only on the grounds that the factual basis of the penalty was incorrect or the facts were incorrectly interpreted.
- j. If a team withdraws from the League before the first round, that team will automatically be excluded from the League and will have to reapply to join the League.
- k. There will be a fine of £100 if host teams do not return any income from door receipts and any spare programmes together with the gala paperwork within 7 days of the gala.
- I. There will be a deduction of 3 league points if A8 (a) or (b) is not complied with

A7. Pool hire and starting times of galas:

- a. The League Secretary will select and hire the pools to be used for the galas. However he/she may request the team that normally uses the pool to make the booking. The League will pay the pool hire charge either direct or through the team making the booking. All host teams will need to provide the treasurer with a detailed statement of account.
- b. All rounds and finals will be swum short course (25 metre pools).
- c. The league will only bear the cost associated with the AOE for the finalist galas



- d. The League Secretary will notify teams/teams of their venue for each round at least 10 days before the date of the round.
- e. The starting time of the gala will vary depending on the venue and availability of the pool.
- f. The start of the gala (that is the warm-up) will be delayed by up to 20 minutes for any late arrival of a team. The late team should make every possible effort to inform the host team that it is late rather than absent.

A8. Team sheets:

Each team shall provide the following:

- a. The gala team sheet is to be submitted using the National Leagues approved electronic version. Names and qualification of officials are also to be submitted. Team sheets and officials details are to be submitted to **league secretary** at least 7 days in advance of the gala.
- b. Any **amendments** to the electronic team sheet can be submitted on a memory stick to the recorder **prior to the start of the warm up**
- c. The coach/team manager will be required to sign a declaration confirming the details contained on the team sheet are correct.
- d. The recorder will report any missing team sheets to the referee for the failure to be remedied.
- e. Following the gala, the host team will send the digital team sheets and any DBS/CRB self-declaration forms to the League Secretary.
- f. There will be a deduction of 3 league points if (a) or (b) above is not complied with

All Finalist Galas:

- g. The host team will manage the gala and ensure that all the conditions of the licence are met and returns submitted to the licencing officer.
 - h. If the Finalist Gala is licenced and/or Meet Manager software is used Teams that swim in the Western League final round, Team Managers must comply with the following. As well as entering swimmers in the individual events 1 to 50, all swimmers and substitutes must be submitted into the gender specific dummy events 51 and 52 in the Hy-Tek entry file sent to teams by the league secretary before the final round as d) below. Please include all swimmers likely to be called upon as substitutes so that all their details are already on the database should they need to be included in the final. NO ADDITIONS WILL BE ADDED TO THE DATABASE ON THE DAY OF THE EVENT.
 - On the day of the gala, a maximum of 6 manual substitutions per team will be allowed without a signed medical certificate from a doctor, provided the team complies with A8 (h) if appropriate
 - j. In all Finalist Galas, the NASLW digital team sheets along with the Meet Manager file with the names of swimmers in each event and their order of swimming must be sent to the **league secretary at least 10 days in advance.** Late changes must be notified as soon as possible, and by start of warm-up at the latest.



A9. Recording and notification of results:

- a. Swimmers placing and times as ratified by the referee will be recorded by the host team recorders. In accordance with normal practice where Automatic Operating Equipment (AOE) is in use the placing and times displayed are subject to ratification.
- b. Results must be recorded electronically using the official recording sheet in approved version, supplied by the League Secretary together with reports and results from meet management software if the meet is licensed. Results should be announced at the end of the gala as "Subject to any adjustments to be made by the League Secretary" and the teams that have attended should be notified either at the gala itself or by e-mail as soon as possible afterwards, noting that the results may be subject to ratification by the League.
- c. The delegate of the host team will be responsible for notifying the League Secretary of the full results of the gala by telephone, (07974 56 44 06) or Email: AdrianEdwardsGilwern@Gmail.com by noon the following day. Written confirmation together with the team sheets, DBS/CRB declarations should also be received by the League Secretary no later than Wednesday following the gala. Secretary Address, Ty-Nant, Old Trap Road, Gilwern, Monmouthshire, NP7 OHW
- d. The League Secretary will inform teams of the results and league tables after each round.

A10. The competition structure:

The league will be divided into divisions as follows. The top division shall be called the Premier Division followed by Division 1 and subsequent divisions.

- a. The Premier Division will consist of 18 teams.
- b. Division 1 will consist of up to 24 teams to be determined at the AGM.
- c. Division 2 will consist of up to 24 teams from the remaining number of teams. If there are more than 24 teams, the number of teams should maximize 8 lane pools

A11. League Structure for Round 1:

- a. Application to join the League will be considered at the AGM and the AGM will decide on which teams to admit based on rational criteria. It must convey these criteria to applicant teams on request.
- b. Initial entry into the league will be via the lowest division.
- c. A draw will be made at the AGM for each division or to divide the teams into galas as required by the number of teams and number of galas in Round 1, except the Premier Division where the top three finalist teams from the previous year's competition will be seeded i.e. the first placed team will go into Gala 1, 2nd into Gala 2 and 3rd into Gala 3. A draw will be taken at the AGM to allocate the other teams to galas.
- d. If, following the promotion and relegation process at the end of the previous season of competition as described in A12, withdrawals of a team or teams takes place, any vacancies in a division created by withdrawals from the League will be filled at the AGM by promotion of the next high ranked team from the previous season in the next lower division, repeated through lower divisions if necessary to maintain the number of teams required in the higher divisions.
- e. If vacancies occur between the AGM and 1 September of any year, the Secretary will promote any teams necessary to fill the gaps in galas in the higher division by promotion of the next highest ranked team from the previous season in the next lower division,



repeated through lower divisions if necessary to maintain the number of teams required in the higher divisions as in (d), and notify the promoted teams as soon as possible. The promoted team will take the gala place that has been left vacant.

- f. If vacancies occur on or after the 1 September the gaps will not be filled but the teams withdrawn will be considered to have failed to attend the galas and be given zero points in each gala. In all subsequent allocations to galas and award of gala and league points the remaining teams will be treated as if the withdrawn team were present.
- g. If these promotions after the AGM create an imbalance in the number of teams attending each gala in the lowest division, the Secretary may make suitable re-arrangements.
- h. Any team made up from a conglomerate of clubs will be charged the same fee as each club/team would need to pay.

A12. Promotion and relegation at the end of the 3 rounds of competition:

- a. Promotion and relegation will be based on the final rankings in each division.
- b. Three teams will be promoted between each pair of divisions and three teams relegated.
- c. Promotion and relegation are mandatory.

This programme may be subject to changes to following the National Annual General Meeting, due to the changes in the competition structure set out by the SWIM ENGLAND.



The scoring system within galas: Gala points:

The number of teams in the Premier Division will be 18 teams.

Rounds 1 & 2 will be held in galas of 6 teams per gala.

Round 3 will be held in galas of 10 teams for the top gala and 8 teams for the second gala if possible. If this is not possible there will be 8 teams in the top gala and 5 teams in each of the other galas.

In all other divisions, galas of 8 teams per gala per round will take place where possible

If there are fewer teams in the division the Secretary is empowered to vary these arrangements.

In the case of a dead heat in a race, each team will be given equal points: For example if there is a dead heat for 4th place in a race in a gala of 6 teams the points will be 6, 5, 4, 3, 3, 1.

If a swimmer is disqualified or the team fails to provide a swimmer in a particular race no gala points will be awarded to that team for that event.

The points achieved by a team in each race will be added to obtain the total gala points for that team.

Teams that fail to attend a gala or are considered to have failed to attend because of a late withdrawal from the League will be given 0 gala points.

In Rounds 1 & 2:

When the number of allocated teams is a mixture of 8 & 7 the League Secretary will multiply the total gala points for each team in the gala with 7 teams by 9/8. The gala points so attained will be rounded up if necessary to a whole number.

When the number of allocated teams is a mixture of 7 & 6 the League Secretary will multiply the total gala points for each team in the gala with 6 teams by 8/7. The gala points so attained will be rounded up if necessary to a whole number.

When the number of allocated teams is a mixture of 6 & 5 the League Secretary will multiply the total gala points for each team in the gala with 5 teams by 7/6. The gala points so attained will be rounded up if necessary to a whole number.

The above formula is to be replicated if fewer teams are allocated.

In Round 3: No adjustment is made.



League points:

<u>In Rounds 1 & 2:</u>

League points will be allocated in each round on the basis of the final position of a team in its gala as follows:

Following Round 3:

League points achieved in Round 3 will be doubled for those teams swimming in the finalist gala (Gala 1) and each team is given a bonus of 10 league points.

The teams in Gala 2 in Round 3 in each division will receive a bonus of 5 league points.

The teams in all other galas in Round 3 will receive no bonus league points.

Allocation to galas:

For Round 1:

The allocation to galas will be decided at the AGM in order of the draw for each division to divide the teams into galas as required by the number of teams and number of galas in Round 1, except the Premier Division where the top three finalist teams from the previous year's competition will be seeded i.e. the first placed team will go into Gala 1, 2nd into Gala 2 and 3rd into Gala 3.

Preferably there will be at least 3 galas, if this is not possible because of pool availability the Secretary will make the necessary rearrangement (based on the order in which the teams were drawn at the AGM) to hold 4 galas or more as follows (the numbers in the cells are the order of the draw):

For Round 2:

The teams will be ranked in order of gala points gained in Round 1 and where teams have obtained an equal number of gala points the order among those teams will be decided by the number of first places gained, and if necessary the number of second places. In all cases this will be highest to lowest.

Teams will then be allocated to Round 2 galas as in the table above

For Round 3:

After Rounds 1 & 2, the teams in each division will be ranked in accordance with the total league points gained in Rounds 1 & 2. When two or more teams have the same number of league points the ranking among these teams will be based on the total gala points gained in Rounds 1 & 2. In all cases this will be highest to lowest.

For the Premier Division, Round 3 will be held in galas of 10 teams for the top gala and 8 teams for the second gala if possible. If this is not possible there will be 8 teams in the top gala and 5 teams in each of the other galas.

For all other divisions the galas will be filled based on the ranking as detailed above depending on the availability of 8 or 6 lane pools.

Final rankings:

Teams will be ranked within each division in order of the total of league points achieved in all three rounds, including the doubling of points in finalist galas and the bonus points.

In the event of a tie the teams in the tie will be ranked in accordance with the total number of gala points achieved in all three rounds.

If there is still a tie the teams in the tie will be ranked in accordance with the number of first places achieved in all three rounds.

Allocation to lanes:

For round one, the teams will be allocated lanes according to the draw at the AGM except for the Premier Division where the top three finalist teams from the previous year's competition will be seeded i.e. the first placed team will go into Gala 1, 2nd into Gala 2 and 3rd into Gala 3.

The top three finalist teams from the previous year will swim in the centre lane and the other teams spearheaded according to the draw. For rounds two and three lanes will be allocated by the League Secretary based on the results from the previous rounds. Lanes will be "spearheaded" in accordance with the usual rules.




Host Team Jobs Check List

	Seven days before the gala	Tick
1	Venue : This has been booked by the league or the host team. Contact the pool 7 days before the gala to ensure that all the requirements for the gala are available, such as starting platforms, wave-resisting lane ropes. The pool will be booked for 3 hours. The competition programme is expected to last for about 2 hours 15 minutes following a warm-up of 20 minutes.	
2	<u>Programmes:</u> Ensure that the programmes have arrived (These are supplied by the League). If not inform the League Secretary immediately.	
1	On the day at the gala Recording of results: Results must be recorded on a computer using the official recording program supplied by the League results Secretary at: AdrianEdwardsGilwern@Gmail.com or downloaded from www.nationalarenaswimmingleague.org Results should be announced as "Subject to any adjustments to be made by the League Secretary".	
2	Promoter's conditions: Ensure that the referee has a copy of the promoter's conditions. These can be downloaded from the website www.nationalarenaswimmingleague.org	
3	The Host Team Representative: He / she must ensure that the correct safety announcements are made before warm up and before the competition starts.	
4	Warm up: Team managers or coaches should supervise all warm ups.	
5	Photography & filming: This will be allowed in accordance with Home Countries guidelines.	
6	Lane allocation: Lanes will be allocated by the League Secretary.	
7	Accident book: The host team should have a team accident book available.	
8	Admission costs: Non-finalist galas: Spectators £4.00 (Concessions £2.00) Finalist galas: Spectators £6.00 (Concessions £3.00) There will be no charge for a programme. Concessions mean Children under 16 years of age and adults 65 years of age & over.	
	After the gala	
1	Results : Send file and results by email to the League Secretary by noon the day following the gala. Notify the teams that have attended either at the gala itself or by e-mail as soon as possible afterwards, noting that the results will be subject to ratification by the League.	



2	Results: Send hard copies of the full results of the gala with all the relevant paperwork and any spare programmes. These should arrive at the League Secretary by the Wednesday following the gala. (This is essential to enable the League Secretary to allocate teams to galas for the following round and ensure that arrangements are in place in adequate time for the following gala.)	
3	Gala receipts: The proceeds of the admission charges are the property of the League and must be forwarded to the League Secretary within 7 days of the gala. There will be a fine of £100 if host teams do not return any income from door receipts along with spare programmes within 7 days of the gala and the gala receipts proforma.
